Together they listen to four students from across the school read. Both Pepper and Janine are a calming presence and are greeted with enthusiasm by whomever they meet! We thank them for volunteering their time to this worthy program.

Rooms 3 and 4 history excursion

As part of our learning about history in our local area, we investigated swimming over time in Mount Gambier, from the ocean to the Valley Lake and now the Wulanda Recreation and

Convention Centre.

We met Danni at the Mount Gambier Library who shared photos and information about past swimming opportunities. We were amazed to discover there was a Public Bath built in the Cave Gardens in 1898, which was used for several decades. We were also interested to learn that for a while, men and

women had separate swimming times as it was deemed not appropriate for them to partake in such an activity together. We know that has changed over time.

We stood on the pavers in the Cave Gardens, which show the size of the Percy Browne Public Baths and marveled at the size. Danni shared photos of the Olympic Swimming Pool built at O'Halloran Terrace in 1957, and the Mount Gambier Aquatic Centre (built 1986). Our students have memories of swimming lessons there!

And now we have the Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre. We were given a tour of Wulanda by Helen. This was a new experience for some students and a very exciting one. We

have been fascinated by how swimming opportunities have changed in our local area over the past century!

We thank the Mount Gambier Library, Wulanda Recreation and Convention Centre and Hopgoods Bus service for building on our learning in the resource centre.
