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The Garden offers many learning opportunities for the students of McDonald Park School. It is a wonderful space where they get to learn about and enjoy the produce that is grown.


SRC leaders asked Kristen Arbery, our Garden specialist some questions about how the garden is used.

She cares for the animals in our garden by teaching classes how to care for them. Students change the bedding, put new food in, change the water, tidy up their pens and get them anything else they need.

Kristen makes sure all students from year 2 to year 6 have a go at everything. They are able to plant seeds, turn the soil, weed garden beds and test the soil to make sure it is good for the plants and vegetables that are growing. They are able to harvest the produce, rake up the leaves, and generally tidy up.



In our garden we grow lots of vegetables and fruits, similar to what we eat at home. We grow zucchini's, carrots, cabbage, tomatoes, lemons, broad beans, brussel sprouts, apples, pears, locates, apricots, plums, nectarines, tamarillos, mandarins, and oranges. Classes use this produce in kitchen lessons to cook and eat.



Once a year classes also get to make pizza in the pizza oven. It's so yummy. We really are very lucky to have our garden and the produce we grow. It's a beautiful space.
