EXTERNAL SCHOOL REVIEW

As part of our continuous school improvement process, we will be involved in an external review with a Department for Education review team.

The purpose of external reviews is to support us to raise achievement, sustain high performance and provide quality assurance to build confidence in public schools. All public schools are generally externally reviewed every 3 years.

The focus of the external review is to evaluate our school's performance. The review team includes a review officer and one review principal. Our school review will occur on October 31st and November 1st.

The review team will identify aspects of our school's improvement that have been verified through the review process, as well as the improvements that we need to make in the future.

During the external school review, some students, parents, governing council members and staff will be asked to provide information to the review team in a number of ways. These include:

- group discussions (with students or staff or parents)
- meetings (staff meeting)
- visits to classrooms.

Parents of students identified to talk about their learning will be notified and permission to be involved sought.
