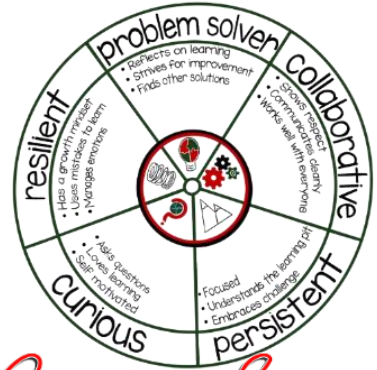

MATERIALS & SERVICES CHARGES 2024

Governing Council approved the materials and service fee to be set at \$354.00 per student for 2024. The subsequent poll conducted by the school resulted in a majority vote in favour of making this fee the amount that is legally recoverable. This fee contributes to the costs of materials and charges for items such as stationery, internet access, art and craft materials, photocopying, sports equipment, library books and the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program.

Invoices will be raised and mailed in January 2024 along with information regarding payment options. Families may apply for school card if they believe they will be eligible, which is income assessed each year and covers this fee. School card forms will be available from January 2024 at the front office or an online application may be lodged via the state government website at www.sa.gov.au.

MCPARK MARKET

This term in economics and business the year 5/6 classes have been learning about what makes a successful business. As part of our learning we have looked at goods and services, what resources businesses use, the planning needed to run a business and how they make a profit. In groups, students created their own business. They conducted market research, identified the goods or services they would offer, created a business plan, considered a risk matrix and pitched their business to a "shark tank" of local business people in order to secure an initial ten dollar investment. Groups could apply for additional donated funding from Woolworths or Coles. The businesses then came together at lunchtime in week 7 to present the McPark Market to their customers (other students). Businesses included a wide range of foods and activities and all groups made a profit and were able to return their investment. Profits were donated to Four Reasons Why who have recently been very generous in their support of many of our students to attend camps.

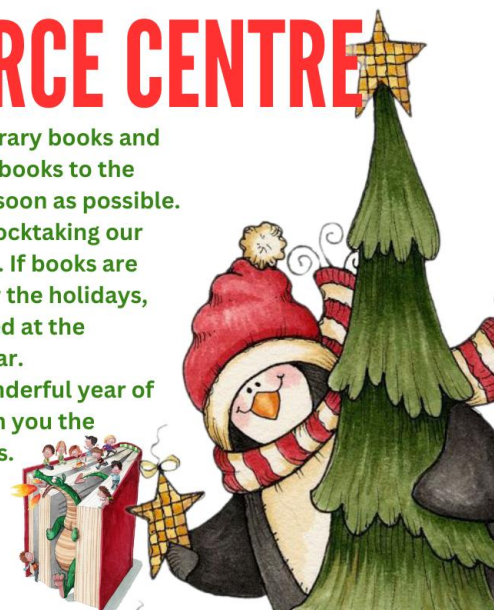
