#### Mr Snotbottom Performance

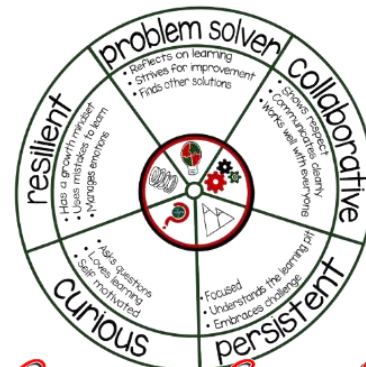
Students were thrilled by the hilarious performance of Mr Snotbottom. His comedic antics and engaging show were a hit, providing a delightful break from the usual school routine.

2. Gives time to listen, share, play games, read stories, write stories.
3. Spends time involved in activities within the school.
4. Confidentiality must be observed at all times.

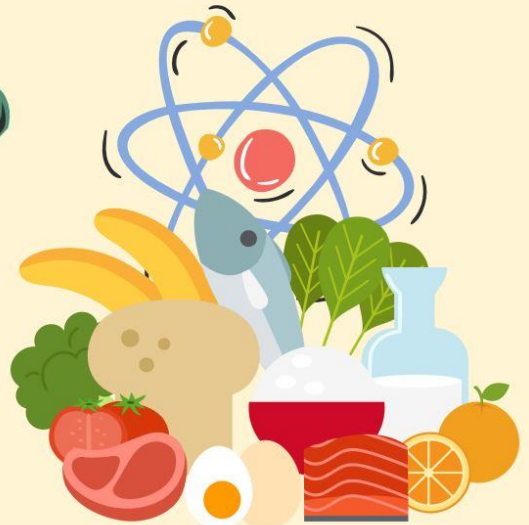
